Thank you for letting me know that Vic Roads has approved the 'trimming' of the Oak trees in the Yendon Avenue of Honour.

As the trees stand four deck B Double stock trucks get through by brushing the trees so I can imagine that 'Trimming' will mean something more severe.

In 2014 the Yendon community, having arranged for some trees to be replaced, held a ceremony on Anzac day.

The road was closed and 300 people attended. It was a wonderful occasion.

If there is one issue which will unite the entire Yendon Community in opposition to the wind farm it is the prospect of anyone messing with those trees.

I recommend that Macquarie takes immediate steps to avoid the inevitable confrontation which will occur if the current plan proceeds.
