4	 Update from Charlie Perry from Vestas, haulage route and potential night works Power poles lying on the road, network connection to Ballarat sub station. Elaine, Powercor, no access in paddocks, works taking place inside substation Manufacturing of 540 components, all by 24 towers are manufactured at Keppel Prince manufactured overseas in China and Vietnam, First items shipped to site anchor cages Required strength is 28 days to set for turbine foundations, 7-21 days to set, set so you can walk on it 48 hours, covers and blankets to retain moisture Route for the main components was discussed, CP provided maps Smallest turbine components are the hubs, the biggest is the blades, blades 67 metres long, trucks is 75 metres, tip of the blade out the back Nacelles are 4 metres high, 105 tonne, approval process to go through, route negotiated 38 turbines Yendon 22 Elaine, A300 turn off for Elaine, site entrances turn into. Mike asked about trees in Yendon, TW said that there will be meeting in October. Two routes, exception 5 turbines, 15 deliveries are coming into Gordon because some bridges won't take the loads. Time frames, Nov to Apr, Elaine, March to June 2019, first turbine up early December. National heavy vehicle register, Narmbool and school groups, we will talk to Narmbool on a regular basis. Midland Highway rolling closure, spots where you can overtake, some areas where you can't overtake. This is part of reason why the movements need to take place overnight.

	 Nightworks, constrained by wind, hard to construct while wind is blowing. Part way through the erection of turbines, need to carry on to make it structurally sound, grout the base, hold point, once the tower goes up the nacelle needs to go on. Not planning on doing nightworks every night, we get a wind forecast and plan the week out. Can't really do works in constant darkness, not ideal or safe as during the day. Nov to Apr, some works going into the evening. Noise and tradies coming backwards and forwards. There will be about see 15 cars leaving site at night. Overnight works, not anticipating a lot of these. Isolated. Will be happening, some weeks may be required. Haulage maps will go on the website.
