2023 Community Benefit Fund update


Now in its seventh year, the Lal Lal Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund has been established to provide financial sponsorship support for a range of community-based initiatives, projects and events that benefit local communities. The Fund is open to a range of community purposes and needs including health and social welfare, safety, environmental, educational, youth projects, sport and recreation, culture, the arts and economic development.

Applications for the **2023 Community Benefit Fund has now closed** and similar to previous years, it's been great to see so many community organisations applying.

This year eight community projects will share in over \$100k in grants with funding spread across Bungaree, Clarendon, Dunnstown, Elaine, and Yendon these include;

- Bungaree Football and Netball Club to purchase a portable stage for events like awards nights, guest speakers and live entertainment
- Bungaree Bowling Club for maintenance equipment for the bowling green, line marking and gardening equipment
- Clarendon Recreation Reserve for tennis court fencing
- **Dunnstown Community Centre** an update to the heating at the community centre
- Elaine Mechanics Hall to replace deteriorating doors and add a spruce of paint
- Elaine Rec Reserve to install and purchase new shades over the playground recreation reserve
- Lal Lal Primary School to improve safety and install security cameras
- Lal Soldiers Memorial Hall to update the cooking facilities within the Soldiers Memorial Hall

We look forward to sharing updates on some of these projects in the months to come.
